





Begin Your Day Productively:

Studies have shown that starting your day by accomplishing even the smallest of tasks will help you gain momentum for completing larger tasks later in the day and help you feel less anxious/depressed about the day ahead!

Start off your morning by doing as many of the following little things as you can:

- Get out of bed as soon as your alarm goes off
- Make your bed (or at least your side of the bed)
- Stretch the limbs and muscles of your body for 5-10 minutes
- Eat something, even if it's small
- Drink at least one room-temperature glass of water
- Brush/floss your teeth
- Get dressed - even if you aren't leaving the house
- Sit in silence for at least 5 minutes and just focus on breathing
- Read the news or a magazine/book for 10 minutes
- Text someone in your life "Good morning!"

## Did you know?


Women's History Month is a celebration of women's contributions to history, culture, and society. The United States has observed it annually throughout the month of March since 1987.

## Did you know?


