Dr. Andrew Gulliford, professor of history and environmental studies at Fort Lewis College, was a co-editor on the book and will discuss the history of wolves in Colorado, and in particular why they were killed in the 1920s.


*This talk is meant to be both objective and informative for people wanting to learn more about wolves in Colorado. rather than serve as a debate about the possibility of their re-introduction.

"Chasing Denali" Author Visit



The history of mountaineering began on Denali with the legendary story of four gold miners who claimed to have summited after climbing more than 8,000 feet of steep snow and ice, then descended - in a single and incredibly dangerous day in 1910 all the while lugging a 25pound, 14-foot flagpole to mark their success.

Was the expedition a success or a hoax? Detailed in his newest book "Chasing Denali", Denali expert Jon Waterman chases the truth during his final climb of the mountain and relates his findings in an attempt to solve one of the most colorful mountaineering mysteries ever told.




Hold Priscilla the milk snake and check out the hissing.

Adult Summer Reading: Read to the Moon!


This summer at the ICL adults can take part in the summer reading fun just as much as kids!
