

Saturday, November 30 at 1:00 p.m.






BRAIN TEASER

NEED A GOOD DESSERT FOR YOUR FOOD ENDEAVORS THIS MONTH?

Try this! Apple Pie Monkey Bread.



Ingredients: 3 8 oz tubes refrigerated biscuits 1 cup of sugar 1 tsp apple pie spice 2 apples peeled, cored, and diced

1/2 cup butter

Remove biscuits from tubes and cut each biscuit into quarters. Place sugar and apple pie spice in a large, plastic zip top bag.

Working in batches, place a few quartered biscuits into the bag and shake to coat. Remove biscuits from bag and place into a large mixing bowl. Repeat until all biscuits have been coated in the sugar mixture.

Add in diced apples to the mixing bowl and stir gently to incorporate apples evenly into the mix. Transfer mixture to a well greased bundt pan. Pour melted butter over top.

Bake at 375 degrees for 25 - 30 minutes. Cool for 5 minutes, then loosen sides of cake and invert onto a cooling rack to cool completely.

Native American Heritage book of the month

The same year that Apollo 11 astronaut Neil Armstrong took small steps on the moon, two writers made a giant leap for Native American studies. In 1969, N. Scott Momaday (Kiowa) won the Pulitzer Prize for fiction with his novel House Made of Dawn, becoming the lone American Indian author to do so. While oral storytelling has always flourished amongst America's first citizens, only nine Native-written novels had made their way to print prior to Momaday's classic work. I refer to this dearth of published American Indian literature simply as the time "Before Momaday." The paradigm shift continued with Vine Deloria Jr.'s (Standing Rock Sioux) Custer Died for Your Sins: An Indian Manifesto, a nonfiction work that shared blunt assessments alongside humorous observations about what was needed in tribal communities. Deloria's book is a lodestar that guided Native scholars for generations, holding a hallowed place equal to Momaday in the canon of Native literature. Although these books are celebrating their golden anniversaries, their wisdom is as stirring today as it was 50 years ago.
