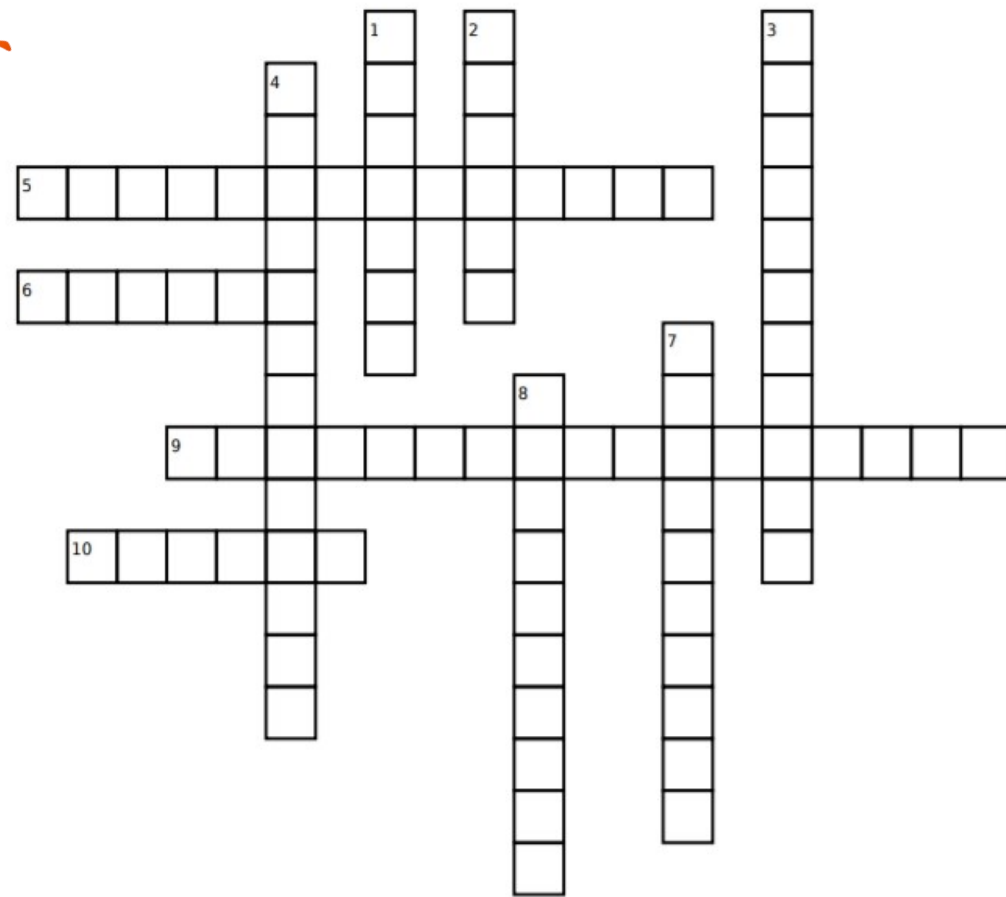

This makes it easier to listen to your favorite audiobooks outside of the car or away from the CD player. Just download the *Libby* app on your device of choice. Once in the app find your local library to see their digital collection. Then you can borrow items instantly to have on your device. All you need is an up to date library card number.

Trail of Lightning by Rebecca Roanhorse

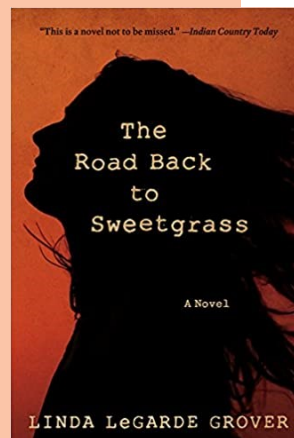
