

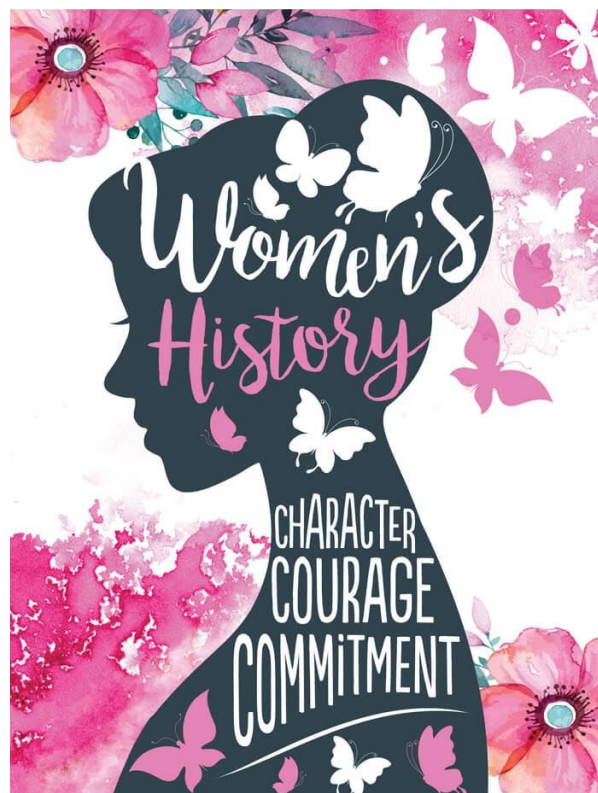

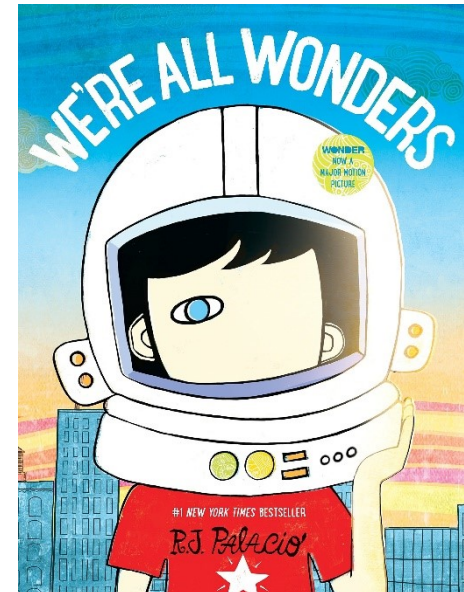


Wonder
