TIME FOR REFLECTION WITH MR. RON

In our crazy digital world, filled with technology that is continuously evolving, most of us spend large tracts of time plugged in and connected to the larger world. It can be extremely difficult - but necessary - to look inward and reflect on our own experiences from this past year. Reflection gives our brain a chance to pause amidst the chaos, to really sort through and think about our observations and experiences, and interpret our past to give new meaning to the future. With this thought in mind I want to reflect on some of the high points that took place at the library and in the IDEA LAB during 2023.

First the library established a student intern program. This program gives High School students the opportunity to gain valuable experiences while training to work in a library. The library would like to see a greater number of students participating in the program as those students who have been interns show positive personal and professional skills growth. If you know of a High School student who would benefit from this experience please encourage them to fill out an application for the coming semester.

All of the library's weekly maker groups continue to provide support, encouragement and skills sharing. With sewing on Mondays, art on Tuesdays, electronics on Wednesdays, and knitting on Thursdays, there is always something to learn or practice. The electronics class has seen some of the participants branch out from basic instruction to creating and repairing individual projects. You do not need anything but a willingness to learn to join any or all of these groups. Additionally, on many Fridays, Dixie and Dorothy have hosted crafting workshops while using the Cricut Machine to produce seasonal decorations. The groups will almost always have equipment and materials available for you to use to get started.

The Repair Cafe has been a big hit! Volunteers are the heart of this organization and we are always looking for more folks wanting to help, not just with repairs but also with record keeping, marketing and more. It is never easy to find a time that works for everyone, and while Thursday evenings were good during the summer, I have a number of people who would rather not chance a drive in the dark. The Repair Cafe will be moving to the first Saturdays afternoon until April when it will resume on the first Thursdays at 6 pm.

As the IDEA LAB Educator I had more opportunities than ever this year to work with teachers and their students. Whether it is visiting a remote classroom or bringing students to the library, instruction was provided in subjects ranging from microscope usage to stop motion animation. I also was able to create and present a variety of STEM demonstrations. The library works to enhance the education of our area youth by providing diverse and quality learning opportunities from K to 12. The addition of the library's bookmobile offers another way to take STEM learning to where it is needed.

Wow, I'm finding all this reflection to be a tiring process: it's not always easy to recall and consider the influence of your ideas and your actions - but selfawareness and growth is essential to the effort of providing rewarding educational opportunities. Not everything turned out the way I had it planned but that's OK. In the last few years I have learned to accept my failures and have come to the understanding that failure is actually an important part of success. By reflecting upon and accessing the value of our library programs and their impact on our patrons, the library is dedicated to providing interesting and important events that will be more in tune with the goals and aspirations of those we serve and help fulfill our mission of "bringing people and ideas together for learning and personal growth.




TEEN NIGHT


VOICES OF IGNACIO PROJECT




DUNGEONS & DRAGONS
