ELECTRONICS HOUR

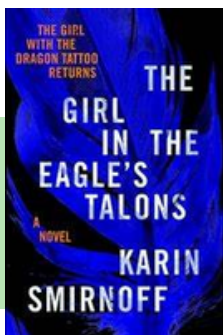

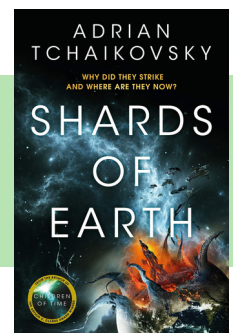

LIBRARY AFLOAT WITH BOAT PLANS

“Believe me my young friend, there is nothing—absolutely nothing—half so much worth doing as simply messing around in boats.” This quote from Ratty in *The Wind in the Willows* by Kenneth Grahame resonates deeply with me and activities involving boats comprise many of my recreational hours. In fact my friends from the University of Kansas still call me by the nickname Boat Dock, but that is another story. I enormously enjoy spending time on the water but derive almost as much pleasure from building and restoring boats as I do putting them to use. This also involves spending a considerable amount of time researching and evaluating other boats.

So I was pleasantly surprised to find this little-known resource for researching small craft at the Library of Congress. Administered by the National Park Service, the Heritage Documentation Programs documents culturally and historically important resources throughout the United States and makes them available free of charge through a Library of Congress online collection. The Historic American Engineering Record (HAER) is one of three sub-programs within the Heritage Documentation Program (HDP), and a maritime initiative within HAER has documented lighthouses, boat yards, ships, and small craft. The HDP also operates the Historic American Buildings Survey (HABS) and the Historic American Landscape Survey (HALS) which may also be of interest to patrons.

The Collection at the Library of Congress, which can be found at this link: <https://www.loc.gov/pictures/collection/hh/>. Digital copies of the documentation can be searched and downloaded from the website. Contents of documentations packets vary but a full package generally includes a written history, photographs, and drawings. For ships and boats drawings ideally contain plans, profiles, lines (with table of offsets), and details. The collection contains more than 200 small craft from a number of maritime institutions and geographic regions including the Penobscot, Michigan, Florida and Chesapeake Bay Maritime Museums. The collection represents a diverse range of vessel types, construction methods, and historic uses from around the country.

We'll end where we started by finishing Ratty's quote, “In or out of 'em, it doesn't matter. Nothing seems really to matter, that's the charm of it. Whether you get away, or whether you don't; whether you arrive at your destination or whether you reach somewhere else, or whether you never get anywhere at all, you're always busy, and you never do anything in particular; and when you've done it there's always something else to do, and you can do it if you like, but you'd much better not.”
