ICL Welcomes the Glowforge

About ten years ago, the Ignacio Community Library transformed its multipurpose room into the "Idea Lab," a dedicated makerspace, and purchased a 3D printer to introduce additive manufacturing processes to our patrons and the broader Ignacio community. A key aspect of the makerspace mission is to provide the same opportunities to our small town that are typically available only in large metropolitan areas.

Over the years, we have taught dozens of students of all ages, some of whom now own their own printers and have become collaborators or entrepreneurs. The Idea Lab is an open-access, open-source makerspace for people of all ages, regardless of their experience or background. Our goal is to provide STEM education, skill development, and hands-on practice that can lead to career opportunities and advancement for lifelong learners.

However, we cannot afford to be static. The staff at the Idea Lab is constantly seeking new ways to serve our patrons and the community, striving for the best possible outcomes. We are excited to announce that the Ignacio Community Library has added a Glowforge laser engraving and cutting machine to elevate our STEM education offerings and skills acquisition. The Glowforge is known as the most user-friendly laser cutter on the market and provides excellent value, even with the introduction of many new laser engravers in recent years.

Laser cutters and engravers offer a wide range of applications and can work with various materials, making the possibilities nearly endless. You can find numerous videos showcasing project ideas or tutorials on machine use, safety, and design applications. The ICL plans to offer introductory classes with the Glowforge in May; please check our newsletter or calendar for dates and times.

If you are already familiar with the Glowforge or laser cutters in general, we are always looking to collaborate with local makers. If you are considering purchasing a Glowforge, the Ignacio Community Library can provide you with a discount code. This not only saves you money but also benefits the library.

The Idea Lab at the library continues to see increasing interest and usage. In addition to our regularly scheduled programming, the makerspace can be accessed by making a reservation with library staff.


